SPEED DATA ANALYSIS

Our new radar/data collection device was deployed along 88th Ave NW for a few days. This provided us the ability to collect traffic data through a short period of time on a street with low traffic counts. Based on the data collected, we're able to see the wide range of information collected and determine the best reporting criteria for future use. The radar was then used to capture data on 80th Ave NW over a two-week deployment period. Deputies are conducting enforcement details. The Sheriff's Office Motorcycle Unit has been requested to work the area as well.

Staff has identified several areas throughout the city to deploy the radar to begin collecting data.

2021 JAIL ILA – RATE CHANGES

The Sheriff's Office will be making changes to the daily housing rates for inmates in 2021. The 2020 daily housing rate is variable and is based on individual inmate needs. The current classification system includes general population, medical and special needs, and mental health. The proposed change will remove the variable priced classification model and incorporate a flat rate for daily housing.

There are a few reasons for the proposed rate changes.

- Some departments in the county have expressed frustration with factors used to determine an inmate's housing needs
- The proposed flat rate accounts for actual housing costs
- Flat rate housing model is used by other jails. Proposed flat rate for Snohomish County Jail is less than Skagit County and King County Jail.

Stanwood Police will continue to monitor monthly invoices to identify any significant change in billing.

2021 DRUG TASK FORCE ILA – RATE CHANGES

Maintaining our partnership with the Snohomish Regional Drug Task Force is beneficial to the community and police department. The drug task force conducts investigations into mid to upper level drug traffickers. They perform the critical and time-consuming role of developing intelligence, identifying targets and completing investigations. They share resources and information, provide training and assist with low level operations when requested.

Each participating jurisdiction's proportional share to funding the Task Force is based on the jurisdiction's average population count. The City of Stanwood will be asked to contribute \$1357.00 in 2021, down from \$1859.00 in 2020. This change represents a 27% reduction in Stanwood's contribution to the Task Force funding.

The rate reduction is a result of changes made to the funding formula. The formula previously used included funding for an administrative sergeant position. That position no longer exists.
