




STATE ROUTE 532: SNOHOMISH COUNTY, STANWOOD AND CAMANO ISLAND SURVEY



PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT), in partnership with the city of Stanwood, Island County, Snohomish County, Island Transit, Community Transit, and Island Regional Transportation Organization (IRTPO), is conducting an existing conditions analysis of the State Route 532 corridor between Terry's Corner and Interstate 5.

State Route 532 is the primary east-west corridor to Interstate 5 for the city of Stanwood, Camano Island and unincorporated areas of Snohomish County. A technical baseline analysis of SR 532 is intended to provide further evaluation of the highway to determine if the corridor meets regional transportation performance objectives before the implementation of any strategy.
